## Katherine Bode (Australian National University): Reading (as) Data: Modelling Transnational Literary Entanglements

In the 19<sup>th</sup> century, newspapers were the main publishers of fiction in Australia; in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the National Library of Australia's Trove database offers the world's largest open-access collection of mass-digitised historical newspapers. This fortunate confluence of two technological systems enables the discovery of thousands of publications of 19<sup>th</sup>-century novels, novellas and short stories in 21<sup>st</sup>-century digitised pages. Katherine Bode's paper reflects on this project, moving from practical to critical to conceptual considerations. After briefly outlining how this fiction was found, the paper explores ways of using modelling to expand transnational literary history. The paper will conclude with some provocations relating to how we use data to re/construct literary communities and cultures, especially the role and limitations of representation as a conceptual framework for this exercise.
