Autosociobiography is recognized as a new and productive literary genre at the intersection of literary representation, social analysis and political commentary. The workshop traces the global entanglements of autosociobiographic texts: the historical, social, transdisciplinary and transcultural dynamics they discuss, represent and perform.

How do autosociobiographic texts recalibrate the relationship between literary and socio-logical modes of writing past and present? What insights may be gained vis-à-vis the literary and critical histories of autobiography, the Bildungsroman, autofiction, autoethnographical writing and similar genres? The international workshop explores how to expand the focus on autosociobiographic texts beyond class, to include other forms of social exclusion and stratification.
